Collage - Using ready made paper, e.g. music notes, newspaper, magazine cuttings. Charcoal/Chalk
Wax Relief

Sculpture/3D

Wire techniques, twist, link, shape, join. Use small pliers to cut and shape wire.
Use wire as a drawing tool, e.g continuous line drawings translated into wire (Elizabeth Berrien of Alexander Calder)

Or

Use wire as an armature for creating a Papier Mache/Modroc/Copydex/recycled materials sculpture on to, e.g animal sculptures - (Emma Rodgers or more figurative Giacometti sculptures.)

Painting

Painting with Acrylic paint
Using thick layered Paint, adding texture to Paint
Using washes and prepared back grounds
Using bleach to take away and wax to resist

Dry point etching Lino cuts Collographs Polyprints Stencilling
