



Amended Behaviour Policy during Covid-19

The aims of the amended policy are to complement the existing behaviour policy in creating a caring, disciplined and safe environment that reflect the academy's values of Belong, Believe, Achieve.

Pupils and staff are to adhere to the expectations and standards outlined in the existing behaviour policy. In addition, the following modifications have been made and come into effect from Monday 8 June 2020:

Expectations and Routines

- Pupils are expected to wear their normal school uniform with the exception of the school blazer and tie. Pupils may wear a plain navy blue v neck jumper or their PE sweatshirt as an over layer if necessary. Pupils may wear their school PE kit
- Pupils are expected to arrive at school on time and report to their 'groups' location on the main school field as directed. Pupils must leave the school site immediately when dismissed at the end of their allocated lessons
- Pupils are to maintain a social distance of 2m at all times on the way to and from school and during the school day
- Pupils must not leave their desk or move around the classroom without the permission of a member of staff
- Pupils must follow staff instructions at all times
- Pupils displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 should remain at home and inform the school immediately. If symptoms are displayed during the school day, the pupil must inform a member of staff immediately. Pupils and family members must isolate in line with Government guidance
- School will follow protocols outlined in all existing and amended policies
- Pupils must practise good hygiene in line with school advice and guidance
- Pupils must not share equipment, resources, food and other personal items.

Rewards and Sanctions

- Pupils are to be rewarded in line with the existing behaviour policy and praise points are to be recorded in Synergy
- Pupils who do not follow teacher instructions will receive a formal verbal warning (S1). If their behaviour continues to disrupt the learning of others, a second formal verbal warning will be issued by the teacher (S2). If a pupil fails to respond, SLT will be called and the pupil removed to the main school hall for the remainder of their school day (S3). If their behaviour continues to cause concern whilst in the hall, parents/carers will be contacted and the pupil will be sent home.
- If a pupil behaves in an 'unsafe' manner, SLT are to be called immediately and the pupil removed to the main school hall
- If there is a repeat of the behaviours identified in the bullet point above, MBA may ask that the pupil remains at home for a set period of time
- Any persistent breaches of the behaviour policy or a serious breach of the behaviour policy may lead to a FTE or PEX
- Any pupil acting in an unsafe manner, putting the health, safety and wellbeing of any member of the school community at risk will be excluded and the exclusion may be permanent.
