Maths:

Hegarty Maths in an interactive web-based resource where pupils watch video explanations of Maths topics and complete tasks, both for themselves and for their teacher. their teacher can see how they have done, how many times they have watched the support video and give individual feedback on questions they have attempted. Your child can flag any questions they are stuck on for their teacher to check. It is also just one click to request that their password is reset by a member of the Maths team.

Once your child is regularly using Hegarty Maths they can access two types of personalised practice alongside work their teacher has set. Fix Up 5 gives them 5 questions on a topic they have struggled on (along with help videos) to help them improve. Memri offers questions on topics they have successfully mastered to keep those skills.
