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Dear Parent/Carer,

Another busy week is drawing to a close. It is difficult to believe that there are only two more weeks until half term. The students are now very much back into the routines of school and it is great that there has been far less disruption than last year. There are just a couple of things that are surfacing that I would like to ask for your support with.

# Attendance:

I know it is the time of year where there are a lot of cold and flu like illnesses, particularly as we have not all mixed properly for so long and it is advisable to keep your child at home if they are displaying symptoms of these illnesses and they feel unwell. Please continue to use lateral flow testing kits, that are supplied by school to test your child regularly for covid: this will minimis the spread of the virus in the school population. In terms of general attendance, please encourage your child to aim for 100% attendance: the link between achievement and attendance is proven and school really is the best place for your child on a day to day basis.

## Uniform:

Please will you ensure that your child is coming to school in the correct uniform. Students, if choosing to wear a skirt, should only wear the Morecambe Bay approved school skirt. Skirts should sit just above the knee or be longer. We have been talking to students this week about uniform and will be having a uniform week next week where uniform will be checked across school. If you have difficulty in obtaining any uniform, please contact school and we will do our best to help. If you need any financial assistance in providing uniform or equipment please contact us, this will always remain confidential and we can help.


