Dear Parent/Carer,

I am delighted to be writing the introduction to this newsletter where we are able to share our news from around the academy. It has been a pleasure to meet all of our pupils in assemblies and talk about our expectations in terms of behaviour, appearance and punctuality, aspects of our society that are fundamental to good order. We believe it is essential that our pupils clearly understand what we expect and why these things are essential in our community. Please note that we expect pupils to be in registration at 8.55am. Ideally pupils should be in school by 8.50am to ensure they are not late.

We have made significant changes over Easter to enhance the safeguarding of your children. We have moved reception to the Gatehouse so that visitors no longer come into school to sign in. We have also installed CCTV across the whole site. And we will shortly be going live on a signing in system for sixth form pupils so we know who is in school at any time.

I am keen to get to know more about the community we serve and improve communication with parents. To that end, I will be holding a parent clinic each Thursday morning from 9.00am to 10.30am. At this clinic, you can discuss concerns or other matters that you may have without prior appointment.

Please enjoy the Bank Holiday weekend, remembering that we are closed tomorrow for the Queen's Golden Jubilee.

Attendance guidance

You will be aware that the guidance regarding COVID has changed nationally. The updated details are as follows:

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they feel well enough to attend.
- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel
 unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well
 enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.
- In the event that a Covid-19 test is taken, adults with a positive test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice is 3 days.

• There is no longer a requirement for students or staff to return a negative test before returning to school once they have remained at home for the recommended period of time. In school we will be continuing to ensure good ventilation at all times. Students may continue to wear face coverings if they wish.

Changes to our remote learning provision

The temporary provisions in the Coronavirus Act 2020 expired on 24 March 2022. As a result we are no longer required to provide isolating pupils with work. As a school, our main priority continues to be to deliver high-quality face-to-face education to all pupils and remote education should only ever be considered as a short-term measure and as a last resort. Attending school is the most effective way for your child to learn and this is our collective priority wherever possible.

Should your child have a period of unavoidable absence, all our home learning resources will continue to be managed through Synergy. In the first instance, if your child is absent and well enough to complete work, they should access Synergy and look under the relevant subject pages for their year group. Your child will be able to access a bank of learning resources there relating to their current area of study. It is advised that they follow their timetable for the day in question.

Your child may also wish to access other online tools such as Bedrock Learning or the Oak Academy resources where appropriate in order to supplement their at home learning.

We expect pupils to make contact with their teacher via their school email address or upon their return to school to catch up any work missed through absence.



Also, well done to Matthew Westworth (Year 13) who also represented the school and the County at the Championships.


Technology – Greatwood Visit
