



DRESS CODE

- ✓ No strapless tops (judgement to be used when wearing low cut tops as to whether they are appropriate for a working environment. Underwear should not be visible, which would include avoiding tops made of see through material)
- ✓ Tops must also cover the midriff, i.e. no cropped tops
- ✓ No visible piercings except for ear and nose piercings
- ✓ Shorts are acceptable, but not cycling-style shorts
- ✓ Leggings must not be see-through
- ✓ As a guide, skirts and shorts should be no shorter than halfway down the thigh
- ✓ No torn jeans or tops
- ✓ No offensive slogans
- ✓ No hats or sunglasses to be worn indoors
- ✓ Sandals are allowed, but not flip-flops
- ✓ Students should avoid fluorescent or very bright clothing or footwear
- ✓ No vivid and extreme hair colours
- ✓ Sixth form lanyard to be worn at all times

This dress code has been written to provide a guide for students; it is not an exhaustive list. Therefore, there may be occasions where students' clothing choices may be deemed 'unsuitable' (ie they are too 'casual') for a school sixth form. In these instances, it is expected that the student will be receptive to discussing the appropriateness of their attire with a member of the sixth form team.
