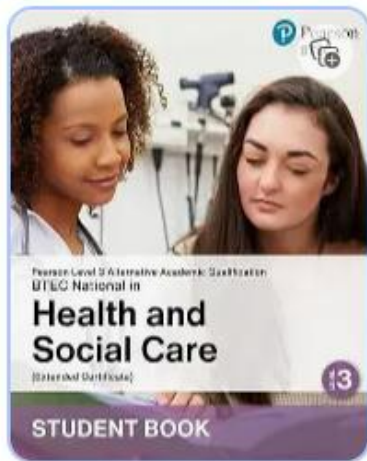

You must watch/read some of the examples given (in the remainder of this booklet) and create notes to help with your essay. Consider the following:

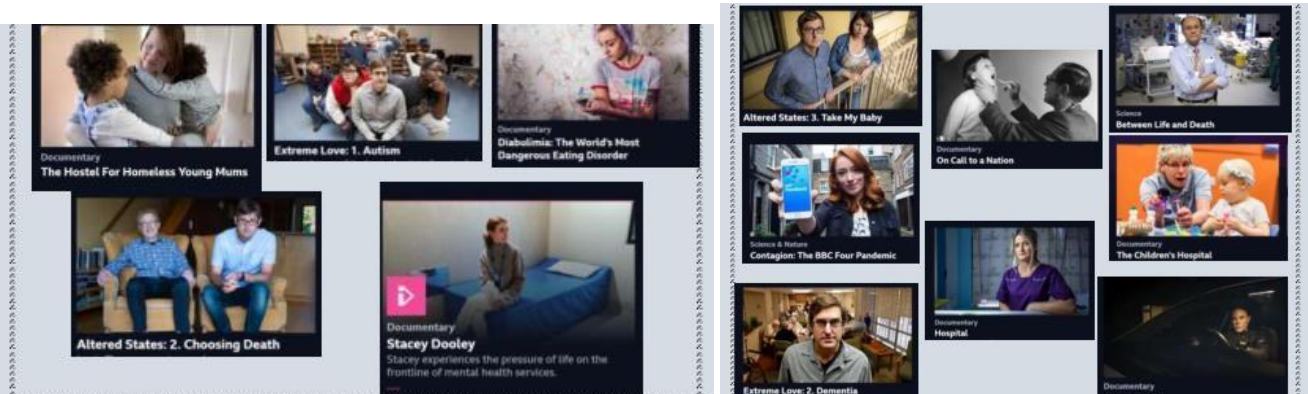
- What issues, if any, are being raised in the stimulus?
